


How to get ready for Microsoft 365 Copilot

- Enterprise customers: Microsoft 365 E3/E5 or Office E3/E5 SMB: Microsoft 365 Business Premium or Business Standard
- ✓ Microsoft Entra ID
- Some features (file restore, OneDrive management, etc.) require a OneDrive account
- ✓ WebSockets (wss://) allowed to endpoints in ID #46 in the section for Microsoft 365 Common and Office Online
- ✓ Update Channels: Microsoft Copilot follows standard practice for deployment and updates
- ✓ Outlook: Users need to be using the new Outlook for <u>Windows</u> or <u>MacOS</u>. Classic Outlook support in February.
- \checkmark Teams: Users must be using Teams desktop or the web app. Both current and new versions of Teams supported²
- ✓ Loop: Tenants must have Loop enabled. <u>Learn more how to enable Loop</u>. <u>Manage Loop Workspaces</u>.
- Review policy settings for connected experiences, otherwise Copilot will not work in M365 Apps

Prompt Engineering



Types of Prompts

Learn: You want Copilot to teach you about a newly assigned technical topic or internal project that is unfamiliar to you.

Create: You want Copilot to write something new for you, such as a slogan, a caption, a story, etc.

Summarize: You want Copilot to condense a long text into a shorter one, such as a summary, an abstract, a headline, etc.

Transform: You want Copilot to change the format of a deliverable so you can make it consumable for your leadership team.

Edit: You want Copilot to improve the quality or readability of a text, such as grammar, spelling, punctuation, etc.

Analyze: You want Copilot to extract or provide some information or insight from a text, such as keywords, topics, sentiment, business-related data set, etc.

Getting started with M365 Copilot



Essential Ingredients of a Good Prompt

A prompt is a short text that you write to ask M365 Copilot to do something for you, such as creating, summarizing, editing, transforming, analyzing, or catching up! A good prompt is like a recipe that tells Copilot what ingredients to use and how to combine them.

Get the most out of Microsoft 365 Copilot by writing precise prompts using this formula

Goal

What do you want from Copilot?

"I want a list of 3-5 bullet points to prepare me..."

+

Context

What is the context in which you are trying to achieve this objective?

"...for an upcoming meeting with Customer X, focused on their current state and what they're looking to achieve."

+

What tone do you want in the output?

Tone

"Respond with enough detail to provide deep context..."



Source

What is the data source?

"...and focus on email and Teams chats over the last couple weeks." How do we help you to succeed?






